Gospel Reflection

I have come to set the earth on fire

In today's gospel Jesus tells the crowds that he came to bring fire – a blaze across the earth!

On these cold winter days, when we think of fire it brings images of comfort, a glow, light and warmth. However, as we've seen in the recent wildfires in California, fire can be dangerous and cause destruction.

What does 'fire' mean in the context of today's Gospel? It is said to mean the fire of the divine love of God, the fire of the Holy Spirit. This holy fire burns, purifies, transforms, overwhelms, thrills and energises.

Jesus spoke with an intensity about the holy fire, with power, and an eagerness to accomplish God's will.

God's will demands service for common good – no matter the risk. Making a decision to serve God and each other, doesn't always make everyone happy. It can challenge injustice and bother those who don't want to change for good. There may be misunderstanding or ill treatment. This could divide families and households. As Christians we don't tend to like division. In these situations, take time to invite the Lord to be with you. Ask him to guide and strengthen you as you need. Stay close to him as you make a stand for what is right and good. By doing this you will be a blessing and light for others. When we bring light to others it multiplies, then suddenly, the earth is a blaze.

Today, what are the ways we can kindle a light?

Lord that we might experience the fire of your love in our hearts today.
