Gospel Reflection

If there is one word that could sum up Pope Francis's vision for the Church of our times, it might be Mercy. Today's readings are rich with images of God and they evoke the quality of mercy strongly. What is your image of God? Maybe you have more than one. How helpful is it in cultivating a close friendship with God?

In my 20s I was involved in a car accident which could've taken my life. It made me think that if the collision had happened differently, I wouldn't be here to write this. To me, it was a God moment giving me an image of God as a merciful protector.

In Exodus 32: 7-14, God was very angry but relented from the punishment that He had in mind for the Israelites. In a fit of anger, we know how hard it is to avoid saying or doing what fills our heart, but our God is merciful. In 1 Timothy 1: 12-17, the apostle Paul acknowledges the 'inexhaustible patience' and mercy shown him considering the bad way he had treated the followers of Jesus before his conversion.

Today is the second Sunday in the Season of Creation and we are encouraged to 'Listen to the Voice of Creation'. Diverse creatures of the earth as well as earth elements feature in the Luke 15 gospel. The three parables contain some enduring images of God's love, forgiveness and mercy. In the first, Jesus is portrayed as the Good Shepherd who is willing to leave the ninety-nine sheep behind and hunt high and low for a missing one. Jesus's wish is that not one should be lost, and He compared the joy of finding what was lost to the joy in heaven over 'one repentant sinner'. In the second parable, God is imaged as a woman who wouldn't give up until she had found the missing coin and how she rejoiced over-the-top after finding it. The third parable about the lost son describes God as a father whose tender-hearted patience and mercy was expressed by treating him as if he had done nothing wrong.

Recent severe weather events in New Zealand and in Pakistan remind us of the ongoing call to make a practical response to 'Climate Change'. What is your

mercy response? How helpful is your image(s)? Whatever it is it won't do justice to the God of mercy found in

these parables.
