WHAT'S HAPPENED SO FAR - 4 Churches 1 Parish

In October 2013 Cardinal John asks our four parishes of St Joseph's, St Francis de Sales, St Bernard's and St Anne's to come together in a new parish in 2016.

May 2014 Our Transition Team comes together to start the building of our boat to carry us on the journey to our new parish.

February 2015 We come together in our own faith communities to talk and dream about what our new parish may be. We finish the hull of our boat when we complete the work on our vision for our new parish.

We are a community of joyful disciples growing together and sharing Christ's message

Pentecost Sunday May 2015 We put up the Mast when all 4 parishes come together to celebrate Mass at St Patrick's College, and on that day we name our boat:

The Catholic Parish of Wellington South

Now we are also praying for the beatification of Suzanne Aubert; when that happens we will change our name with Suzanne Aubert as our Patron. Our journey continues, as the transition team works with the parish communities around the completion of our boat—much of which is unseen, but still important.
