## You have to first cast the seed!

As I sit in my workspace at home I can see five dirt patches left from where I shifted some roses. I've planted grass seed, but being mid-winter it's a bit slow growing. But if I hadn't scattered the seed, they would remain bare sandy patches in the middle of the lawn.

Last weekend I joined with about 70 other people in an Archdiocesan youth ministry event. We were of all ages: mid-teens to people in their 70s. All fired up and totally committed to opening the Church to the enthusiasm and imagination that the is the gift of the young.

We revisited the outcomes of our Archdiocesan Synod in 2017, and looked at Christus Vivit (Christ Lives!), Pope Francis' exhortation on young people – addressed to all of us. It's all about change toward a mission and vocational effort. In my notes I've written: "what stops us? Lack of imagination, and we, the older generation (and that's not an age thing!) have all the reasons why not!". Reasons not to adopt a mission focus; reasons not to let young people address the challenges they face, and do so in our church; reasons not to move from my comfortable space doing what I've always done!

When I reflect on these parables involving sowing and reaping it's easy to get into discussions about finding people to do the sowing; the effort the sower has to put in; the seed not growing unless it falls on the right ground; the good seed growing with the bad, the risks associated with wasted effort and wasted seed, and so on. However, for me what really stands out is that the seed has to be cast, there's no point in it remaining in the bag!

Ask yourself: am I casting the seed? Or do I feel more comfortable with it safe and secure in the bag?

Nothing will happen unless we cast the seed!

# The journey toward complete trust...

For many years my favorite verse has been "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, and lean not unto thine own understanding; in all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6). When I chose that verse, it was because I hoped that one day I would get to the trusting part.

In the year 2000 I married Bill Coorpender and we moved to Gainesville, Florida. Bill and I were fortunate to find Queen of Peace Catholic Church, a welcoming and happy community. It was there that I was first introduced to spiritual direction. It would be the beginning of my journey in Ignatian Spirituality, although I certainly didn't know it at the time.

In the first few years of spiritual direction, my director listened as I brought to our monthly sessions my guilt over my failed first marriage and the heartache over some of my past decisions. I know that we also talked about my relationship with God, my prayer life, and my joys and challenges, but what I remember most are the painful family issues that we talked about in that sacred space. I left each meeting with hope that I would find peace. I also left those meetings with renewed purpose, with motivation to dig deeper into my prayer life, and with a desire to trust in God's plan for me.

I don't think that my directors would be surprised that I don't recall any specific advice that they gave. In fact, spiritual direction, as I now know, is not about giving advice, it is about accompanying the individual as God works in her life. My director helps me notice where God is present with me and in me. Consequently, I am better able to know God's will for me.


In Ignatian spirituality, we call the process of discovering God's will discernment. I've discovered, through on-going spiritual direction, that discernment is not a once-and-done process. I've also discovered that it is not easy to become aware of God's desires for me and that it helps to have a director to accompany me....

... I've learned that discernment becomes easier as it is practiced. It's not complicated, but it does require prayer and listening. And it helps to have a good spiritual director to share the journey. Trusting God has given me great joy as I grow in the vocation to which He has called me.

After these last twenty years receiving and offering spiritual direction, I know firsthand what it means to "trust in the Lord." Ignatian spirituality, especially its discernment wisdom, has been instrumental in bringing me closer to the Lord so that I can trust Him to direct all my decisions.

## Response to Cardinal John's letter by our Parish Pastoral Council, dated 1st July 2020

**Dear Cardinal John** 

Thank you for your letter of 24 June responding to our proposal to address the future of the properties in the Catholic Parish of Wellington South.

Your letter was shared widely within our Parish and has been met with concern and dismay.

Our Parish sought to fully engage with the spirit of the consultation. We feel our proposal enables a future for Wellington South that is both financially viable as well as one that embraces a future in which we are missionary disciples. As you are aware the consultation we undertook was extensive. It was a painful and at times divisive process which now appears to have been unnecessary.

We were surprised to receive your detailed alternative directive as the expectation you set in your letter of 14 November 2019 was that you would not be directly endorsing or declining submissions. Your decision clearly considered views that bypassed the formal consultation process, however at no time over the last eight months was any further information or clarification sought from the mandated Parish Council.

The decision to single out the Samoan community and direct the aulotu to support St Frances de Sales Church has caused distress. We consider the Samoan community at St Anne's to already be well integrated with the wider community, seamlessly so. To admonish the Samoan community in this way has been deeply insulting and shaming for a group who have a strong and integral connection to our Parish. Many in the Parish share with

them the hurt your comments have caused. We know you will be aware of the degree of social need in Newtown and it is the view of the Parish Council that prioritising Mount Victoria and Island Bay over Newtown looks like prioritising the white middle class over the needs of our most vulnerable communities.

We would appreciate further explanation regarding the decision to retain St Frances de Sales as the main parish church and using St Anne's church as a week day only mass centre. We are concerned firstly about the pastoral implications with nearly all ministry in the parish currently centred at St Anne's campus. Reduced hall space impacts adversely on our ministry, including Life Teen, Scouts and young adults. We have developed the hall space in recent years to include space for private meetings with parishioners. We are also concerned about the financial implications of maintaining two churches and the burden this will place on both current and future parishioners. We will not, for example, have the financial base to do the refurbishment work you refer to.

We ask that the independent investigation into potential boundary changes that may enable St Joseph's to separate from Wellington South and partner with the Cathedral be urgently initiated. We do not see a role for the Wellington South Catholic Parish Council in this process but are aware that the work we are required to do will depend on the outcome of this review.

We appreciate that you and the Archdiocese wish to support us meeting the challenges that we currently face. We would like to meet with you to discuss these issues further. Such is the depth of feeling that we also ask that you meet with our parishioners.
