Gospel Reflection

The first week of Lent, and the readings present us with an absolute feast of meaning! These three short passages from Genesis, Romans and Matthew offer a cosmic picture of what it means to be human, while never losing sight of the small stuff of everyday life. In the Genesis passage we are reminded how, created in love and

In the Genesis passage we are reminded how, created in love and gifted with immeasurable blessings, we have managed to do so much harm to each other and to our beautiful earth.

The creation narrative is told as a seemingly simple story. Handed down for thousands of years, it has lasted because it rings true, even if our understanding of evolution and human complexity has greatly expanded as our knowledge of science and psychology has grown. We know a lot more about the 'dust' from which our bodies are formed, about our deep connections with the earth.

The image of the tree of life beautifully sums up the mystery of what makes us human,— our ability to 'know '- to understand, and to recognize the difference between good and evil, and our freedom to choose our response, a very big responsibility. If ever there has been a case where we would have been wise to 'follow maker's instructions' this is it.

Of the tree in the middle of the garden God said, "You must not eat it nor touch it, under pain of death". Was this just a simple test of obedience or much more - a warning that if evil were released into the world it would spread like a virus, contaminating everything, beyond our control? We are learning daily the deep harm that our bad choices make, from minor acts of greed or indifference to policies that cause widespread destruction and hardship.

But in the readings from Romans and Matthew's Gospel, Paul and Matthew remind us how God entered our damaged world in the person of Jesus Christ and showed us, with immeasurable mercy and compassion, how to find our way back to fullness of life as it is meant to be, where the word of God is heeded, where we care for each other and the earth.

We need to look at how we live our lives, and at the effects of our choices. Then, guided by 'makers instructions', repent, and repair the damage where we can, knowing that God will be with us.
