## From Fr Michael

A central question for the first disciples of Jesus after the Resurrection must have been, "What now? Does the Resurrection complete his mission or is there more?" After all the Resurrection was proof that Jesus' message of love and forgiveness was authentic. God was on their side. But there was no sign of defeat for the dreadful Romans. Those who had killed Jesus were still around and still powerful. There was no sign yet of the Kingdom of God being ushered in.

It must have been a strange mix of hope and fear, joy and sadness, confusion and certainty. There was joy that Jesus was with them and they could now see him again and talk to him, and yet everything was utterly different to what they expected.

So they ask themselves: "Have we missed something? Perhaps Jesus had prepared us for this and we have misunderstood?" We can so easily imagine them, huddled in their locked and bolted rooms – going over what he said to them, the stories he told, the things he did... remembering, re-telling, pondering, discussing, praying, disagreeing, arguing, searching... trying to piece together the future for themselves.

Sometimes the words of Jesus can seem like disjointed or repetitive statements put together in a kind of list, and indeed they are: individual memories of the truths Jesus proclaimed. But now, after the Resurrection, they have a deeper meaning than when they were first uttered.

It happens to all of us all the time. People say things for us, or do things for us, and it is only later that we suddenly realise what it was all about. This will be an 'ah-ha' moment, an insight which makes everything different from then on. These moments can come suddenly, but are usually the result of questioning, doubting, pondering, searching.

Jesus is showing us what to expect and preparing us for what will happen... Promising that he will never leave us... Offering us God's own peace... Telling us not to be afraid, that the Holy Spirit will be given to us... Providing wonderful gifts... But somehow we still do not see or we seem to forget.

Pentecost is the great 'ah-ha' event of the early Church. It is the moment when everything Jesus said and did suddenly falls into place. Pentecost is what gives meaning and value to our personal story too. As a dear friend, Jesus picks up our story and weaves it into his own story and then it becomes a blessing.

It is with sadness that I say goodbye, and an enormous THANK YOU to you all. Your constant support, your prayers, your commitment, your willingness to walk the way of Jesus, tell the truth of Jesus and live the life of Jesus have been inspiring.

Archbishop Paul Martin has now succeeded me and has become the 8th Archbishop of Wellington. I wish Paul every blessing and ask that you support him in the same way as you have supported me.



