Gospel Reflection

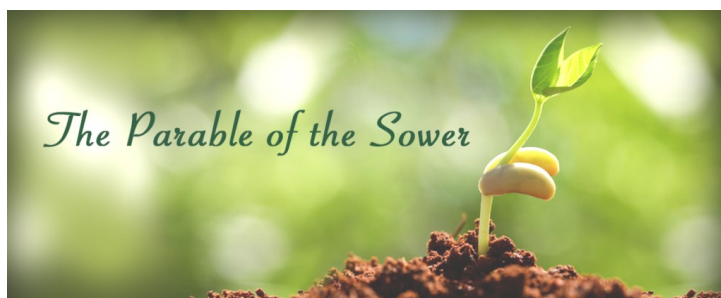
There are two versions of the Gospel today, one nine verses long, the other 23, in which Jesus tells the crowd the parable of the sower. The seed is "the word of the kingdom", or, I suppose, Jesus' message. The fuller version helpfully explains what Jesus means by the different places the seed is sown. The seed sown on the path, falling on a place where it will quickly die, represents the person who hears the word but does not understand it. The seed landing on rocky ground, and so not able to put down deep roots, represents the person who enthusiastically welcomes the word, but when things get hard the word dies. The thorns other seed is sown amongst are the competing things which "choke the word". The seed, the word, sown in good soil can put down roots, withstand the pressures of the world, and as it is well rooted, bear fruit.

I was drawn to write the reflection for this reading as there are different soils in my own garden. There is stoney soil where I try to grow plants, but they are not healthy. The stones provide no food for them - I really should dig out the stones, but it is a big job. In another part of the garden there is sticky clay which becomes boggy in Winter. I need to work out ways to improve the drainage.

Jessica Hutchings and Jo Smith in 'Te Mahi Oneone Hua Parakore: A Māori Soil Sovereignty and Wellbeing Handbook' seek to champion "soil as a taonga that we must look after to ensure the wellbeing of our whānau, communities and Aotearoa". I should treat my garden's soil as the taonga, the treasure, it is, remove the stones in the stoney soil and add compost to the clayey soil. Likewise, I need to work on nurturing my personal 'soil' so I may better receive the word and create a place where it can put down deeper roots.

Climate change is much on my mind at the moment. It is bringing changes to our lives that most of us do not fully understand. This emphasises the importance of deep roots; this reading tells me I must do all I can to foster a deeply rooted understanding of Jesus' message to safeguard against the unknown and unpredictable that will surely come. I have gardening to do.

Free budgeting courses for people in South Wellington. The 3 sessions of the CAP Course will put you in control of your money, whether you have a lot or a little.

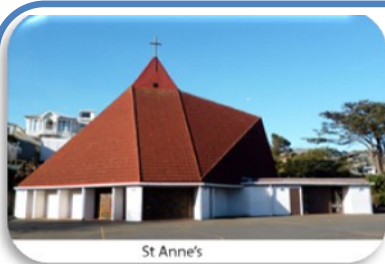
