Gospel Reflection

In this week's readings, we are presented with a profound lesson from King Solomon, a model of wisdom and compassion even today. Despite living around 1,000 years before the birth of Jesus, he already had a remarkable grasp of what it means to be a good Christian.

Solomon was already King of Israel when God appeared to him in a dream. When given the opportunity to ask for anything he desired, rather than seeking personal wealth or power, he humbly implored God to grant him the qualities necessary to understand and serve his people better. What he asked from God was to help him become a better channel of God's will among his subjects.

Using the images from the gospel reading, Solomon found his own treasure hidden in a garden, his own pearl, in putting his service to others over the
