

Dear Parishioners


Regarding His own burden Jesus said, 'My yoke is easy and my burden is light.' How could He, who took on the burdens of so many, say that? Because He carried His burden with love.

Only love can make a heavy burden seem light. Some of our burdens may be baggage which we could and should let go of. There is a story of a wise monk going on a spiritual journey with a heavy bag on his back. On his deathbed he passes on the bag to one of his disciples. When the disciple opens the bag, he finds that it is empty. Yet he wonders to himself why it seemed to weigh so much. The old monk quietly says, 'It is the weight of everything in my life that I did not need to carry.'

Religion should not make life more burdensome, far from it. If Jesus placed any burden on us at all, it was to love one another. Jesus does not take our burdens from us but gives us the strength to carry them. What faith makes possible it is love that makes it easy. It is especially at those times in our lives when it seems burdensome that Jesus invites us to bring our burdens to

Him and He will give us rest. Let us come to Him, humbly, in a spirit of love and of trust.

Predator free Wellington

Join your local community trapping group. www.pfw.org.nz Phase 1 has seen a 51% increase in the detection of birds on the Miramar Peninsula since the eradication began. Phase 2, is the buffer running from the CBD down through the green belt all the way to Island Bay. Work will begin with Wellington institutions like Wellington Zoo, Government House, and Wellington Regional Hospital.

Plastic Free July

A time to bring focus on reducing our plastic use at home and in the workplace. Nationally, we are phasing out hard-to recycle and single-use plastics. A ban continues on single-use produce bags, plates, bowls, cutlery, straws and produce labels which kicked in from 1st of July.
