Dear Parishioners


The theme of the First Reading and the Gospel is that of inclusiveness. At the time Isaiah was writing there were lots of non-Jews who were considered foreigners in Israel. The question arose as to whether or not the benefits of salvation should be extended to them also. Isaiah gave a clear and definitive answer: `"My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples," says the Lord.'

The Early Church faced a similar question regarding the Gentiles.

Matthew sees Jesus as having broken down the barriers between Jews and Gentiles. Even though His mission was first to Israel and the Jewish people, Jesus did reach out to others such as the Canaanite woman in this Gospel. She had extraordinary faith in what Jesus could do and the courage in her demand for dignity and attention for the Lord to heal her daughter.

If we believe Christ died for everyone. No one should be excluded from the all-embracing reach of God's love.

St Bernard's Church was sold last year, and the proceeds were invested in the CDF until suitable projects were identified. Over the past months we have received feedback from Parishioners listing their



ideas about what they would like to use the funds for. At our recent Annual General Meeting the list of ideas the Parish is considering was circulated.

The Parish Council and the Finance committee have agreed that a Catholic presence in the Brooklyn community is a priority for our Parish.

St Bernard's school have been given the approval to upgrade the exterior frontage of the school hall, and to install custom signage for the front of the school to further promote the school and the hall.

More projects will be announced as we work through the practical issues and consult with stakeholders.

The St Bernard's Legacy has given our Parish a unique opportunity to give back to the community as well as to ensure our future.
