Gospel Reflection

In today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah, Eliakim is given authority to open and close the doors of the king's palace. He is given the key to the House of David. In the Old Testament world this means that he had control of everything that went on between the opening and the closing of the doors. Everything that would help people flourish. Only Eliakim can open and close the doors.

If you had the keys who would you let in? How would you enable them to flourish? What do people need today to flourish?

In the gospel we see Simon now being blessed by Jesus to be the foundation of the Church. Peter tells Jesus that while others give Jesus various names, he, Peter, recognises Jesus as the Messiah, the Christ (although he didn't come to this recognition by himself). How would you answer Jesus' question to Peter? Who and what spiritual practices in your own life help you to recognise who Jesus is?

Jesus gives him (Simon) a new name, Peter, meaning rock. It is Peter who is given the keys to the kingdom of heaven. It is Peter who is given the power to bind and loose on earth and in heaven and everything in between, that is, to forbid and permit. We only give the keys to our house to someone we really trust. Jesus shows that he now trusts Peter to interpret his message for the Church. Would Jesus trust you? If Jesus gave you the keys to the kingdom of heaven today, what would you do with them? What would you forbid and permit? Luwi Buchie



I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.

Food Basket


