Gospel Reflection

On first reading the gospel I can totally understand how the workers found it unfair that they were paid the same amount of money no matter how long they worked.

What the parable is trying to teach us is that we all come to God at different times in our lives. That no matter when you come to God you will be treated the same.

Kathleen Rushton explains that Jesus is teaching us about God – convincing us to lay aside jealousy and our sense of unfairness and invite God into our lives the God of Jesus. That we are called to a way of life in which all human beings have equal value.

In the news last week we saw 6800 migrants land in Lampedusa. More than its whole population. How desperate must these people be? This would be the latest stop in a much longer journey. How do they recover from this trauma? How is it fair some people are born into poverty and war and others into wealth and peace? I do hope they have faith.

Thus the last will be first and the first will be last – everyone who has faith, no matter how long or how hard they work during their life will receive eternal life. Salvation is not earned through works but is a gift from God.

The parable also warns against envy and jealousy, encouraging a spirit of contentment and gratitude for God's generosity. This is quite a big statement. I am often a long way from feeling contented, I want more and although God always provides and protects I am again often not always grateful.

Probably my biggest failure when it comes to the 10 commandments is "Thou shall not covet the neighbours goods".

I totally covet my neighbours goods. For this reason I don't like watching Location Location Location because of the houses. Or Country Calendar with all the seemingly perfect families! I think we need to constantly remind ourselves that God is a God of love. God's love for us is so enormous it is truly hard to comprehend. "That you may be transformed by the power of his love which is deeper than the deepest pain". *Virginia McCabe*


Sunday October 1st at 10am


