Gospel Reflection

"BE WATCHFUL! BE ALERT!"

The Advent Season is all about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world as it is today. It is a time for faith communities and families to remember through Prayers, reflections, special music and good deeds what the TRUE meaning of Jesus' birth is.

We long for Steadfast love and Faithfulness to meet, and for Righteousness and Peace to kiss each other, as quote from the Scripture. We trust that faithful actions following God's path of righteousness 'CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE.'

There is a saying; "Expect the unexpected." In family life, we try to prepare for future events of the reality of life. Our next family Christmas, children's education and our retirement. We need to be very careful not to allow ourselves to be caught by surprise, so that we can handle any difficult circumstances or challenges our family may face.

Advent is a time when people welcome the homeless in their homes for the night, a time of thanksgiving for what people receive from others.

Today's Gospel reminds us that we are called to be just as attentive and alert to the coming of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, so that it will not catch us unprepared. This means attending to our family's Spiritual life as carefully as we attend to other important family matters. Also, we need to be ready willingly to receive Jesus in our daily lives and at the end of time. Like the Apostles, Jesus wants us to be watchful and alert at all times, so that we might recognize the signs of Christ in our midst. Therefore, what are some things that we can do to stay alert and ready to welcome Christ when He returns in glory? We need to pray daily as a family, read the Scripture, follow Jesus by keeping the Commandments, love and serve others, recognize Christ's presence in the Sacraments in our daily lives. Encourage our youth to prepare their hearts to welcome Jesus by engaging one of the above activities during Advent.

Like the prophet Isaiah, he expresses his complaints to God as one Who has hidden His face and allowed people to offer due to human crimes. At the end Isaiah confesses his faith to God as Father who cares and models people according to His Will and design. Saint Paul follows Isaiah's thoughts with the attitude of thanksgiving. There's no reason to complain and worry because of the generosity of God, who sees to it that, everyone is equipped with skills and spiritual gifts in Jesus Christ.

If God is faithful to the end, everyone is challenged to be watchful and alert like the security guards in their duty day in and day out. The key word is 'WATCH. We need to watch the words we say, whether they are edifying, teaching, consoling or warning. Watching our actions since they speak louder than words; our thoughts and opinions; our friends and companions; our hearts: emotions, sentiments and awareness, so that when the Lord comes into our lives, we are indeed WATCHFUL and ALERT at all times.

Let us remind ourselves in some of the unexpected events that happened lately in our lives throughout the whole world. Natural disasters such as flood, earthquake, hurricane and climate change. Are we able to do anything about them? How can we deal with them? Always remember what Jesus says in the scripture; "Be watchful and ready. You know not when the Son of Man is coming!"

"Be Watchful! Pray constantly that you may be worthy to stand before the Son of Man!"

"Be Faithful until death, and I will give you the Crown of the life!" Only God the Father knows when Christ will come again. In the meantime, Jesus tells us to be WATCHFUL and ALERT.
