Second Sunday of Advent: Peace as Celebrated in Glorifying God

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, on this Second Sunday of Advent. As we venture further into this season of joyful anticipation and hopeful expectation, today's liturgy invites us to delve into the theme of peace as celebrated in glorifying God, echoing the teachings of Sacrosanctum Concilium, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. The Scripture empowers us to grow in virtue and sanctity.

In the first reading Isaiah declares that God's people are to be comforted, restored and redeemed. The language of the text is very poetical, vivid and replete with metaphors. It is the wilderness of our lives and the desert of our hearts that require preparation. The hills and Valleys are spiritual obstacles of sin and lack of faith comes between God and us. Similarly people must move the uneven ground and rough places in our lives; we need to smooth the path in preparation for the Lord's imminent coming. Another metaphor compares the grass and flowers to our own impermanency and fragility. We may fail God but God never fails us. The text emphasis God's nurturing and care.

The voice of the Holy Spirit and the Church, calls us to actively participate in the divine dialogue with our Lord Jesus, preparing our hearts for His coming both in history and in glory. At this sacred junction, we encounter Isaiah's prophecy heralding John's arrival, echoing the Liturgy's cosmic scope and its transformative power. The psalm underscores the Lord's kindness and justice, aspects intertwined with the peace we seek through active participation in the season of Advent. The second reading urges growth in holiness, aligning with the call to holiness can shape our lives entirely. As we immerse ourselves in

today's Gospel, John the Baptist is the messenger, witness and forerunner. The timeless message of John the Baptist resonates with the themes of repentance, humility, readiness, forgiveness and the true peace found in glorifying God and unity with one another.

As we engage in this sacred celebration, let us open our hearts to the profound peace offered by the scripture and allow it to shape our lives as heralds of the Gospel in the world.

Gospel acclamation: Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: All flesh shall see the salvation of God. .




