Gospel Reflection

God glorified when we are fully alive

The leprosy that features in our first reading and today's gospel is not the modern illness known as Hansen's Disease, but some kind of highly contagious skin condition. In a society that had no such aids as antiseptics or antibiotics to call on, the only way of dealing with the illness was to isolate its victims.

Sadly, the biblical world was inclined to make a link between the physical and spiritual realms, viewing illness as a sign of God's disfavour and asking who might have sinned for such a punishment to be imposed. So those who suffered from leprosy were doubly afflicted – the pain which the symptoms brought, and the even deeper affliction of being excluded from the community – obliged to live a solitary life beyond the pale.


How different from this view is the kingdom proclaimed by Jesus. Asked by the leper if he wants to cure him, Jesus responds, 'Of course I want to!' and reaches out his hand to touch the man kneeling before him. 'Feeling sorry for him' is how one translation describes Jesus' reaction, but another version says that he was 'moved with pity.' It's a gut reaction, an emotion that rises from deep within the Saviour's heart, an impulse stronger than the fear of contagion.

The God whom Jesus comes to proclaim is not one who takes pleasure in seeing anyone isolated and alone. The God of mercy is one who comes to set us free, who rejoices when we are made whole and able to embrace the gift of grace for all we are worth. As the great St Irenaeus, bishop of Lyons, wrote in the second century, 'the glory of God is a human person fully alive.'

We cannot hear this gospel reading without asking ourselves, 'Who are those who live on the fringe of our community? Where is the mercy of God waiting to reach out beyond our comfort zones today? Who are we excluding or

allowing to go unloved and unwanted?' And Pope Francis would tell us that we will find the answer to these questions, not at the centre of our world, but at its edges.
