Dear Parishioners,

The wounds of love, Jesus showed His disciples His hands and feet and encouraged them to touch them. One might have expected the risen Lord to be shining in His glory without any wounds or blemishes. Yet, not only is His body still scared, but it is those very wounds that help the disciples to recognise Him.

Those terrible wounds caused by humiliation, torture and finally crucifixion. Jesus showed these wounds to His apostles, they were the proof of His great love for humanity.

For those who deeply care for others can sometimes pick up many wounds during their lives. Some are visible some are invisible.

Those invisible ones that leave deep furrows in the mind and soul by hardship, worry, anxiety and grief are sometimes harder to deal with than physical hurt.

But these wounds are nothing to be ashamed of. They are proof of our love. Even if nobody else sees them, God sees them and is compassionate for He sees that we resemble His Son and Jesus' wounds give us hope in our own wounds.

The resurrection means that Jesus lives and we can encounter Him in faith. He will be with us where we are, helping to give meaning to our lives,

especially to the painful and dark parts. And like the apostles we too are commissioned to bring the 'Good News' to others.

While their application is in process, the family in Ethiopia are surviving in very poor conditions. While the local family have been providing financial support, their own resources are now very stretched.

Sr Rachel Moreno of the Sisters of Compassion is liaising with the host family and invites Wellington South parishioners to contribute to a fund to relieve this situation. This will be channeled through Caritas Ethiopia for distribution. The need is urgent.
