Gospel Reflection

" I AM THE VINE, YOU ARE THE BRANCHES."

All of the readings of today are concerned with BELONGING, NOURISHMENT and APPRECIATION, something that we are all need of. Life revolves around these needs and desires. These precious gifts are not 'out there.' They must come from within ourselves when, only when we are connected to the vine Jesus Himself, and if not, why not?

In the first reading (Acts 9:26-31), we learn about an incident in the amazing life of Saul of Tarsus, later to become the great St Paul. He was not one of the original Apostles, rather, he was later called by Jesus Himself, and the Apostles learned how Jesus was to use him to grow the Church in the land of the Gentiles.

Responsorial Psalm (22:26b-32), 'The Victory over Death. It is a reflection on the RESURRECTION and an ASSURANCE that Jesus Christ is Risen and still lives among us.

Second reading (1 John 3:18-24) The beginning of this passage refer to the Sincerity of a loving heart. Therefore, if our heart or conscience is free from anxiety, then we will know that we love God and our neighbour in the way we were meant to, 'The Greatest Commandment.

The Gospel reading (John 15:L1-8.) "I Am The Vine, you are the branches." This statement describes a RELATIONSHIP between Jesus and us. It is a relationship of Intimacy, Intensity that demands an abiding that never ends. Abiding in Jesus the Vine and being pruned by Gods the Father, the Vinedresser, our lives begin to bear fruits of Joy, Love, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Gentleness and Self-Control. (Gal. 5:22).

If our Saviour is to reign in our heart so that we may bear FRUITS, then there are some things we must observe. The first thing in the morning is to prepare your heart to be at peace. Ask for God's grace and offer to God all the good you will do during the day. In this way, you will be prepared to bear with peace and serenity all the pain and suffering you will encounter during the day. We must put up with others, but first with ourselves. Most of all do not lose heart. Be Patient! Do all you can to develop a spirit of compassion. What matter most is that we do faithfully all things we need to do, to advance the Kingdom of God in our hearts. Then we can bear much fruit in the world.

FOR YOU AND ME: -

What does it mean to be a Branch who is attached to the Life-Giving vine? Do I only see my relationship with God a personal one-on-one? How do I see that I am part of a community of believers who are called to be united together with the life-giving wine?

What are some of the fruits of my relationship with God that are evident to others and that might draw them into a closer relationship with God and with others?

Therefore let us accept and respect people as they are no matter what. Always be alert and be ready to give a hand when needed, and a willingness to be a friend to those in need
