Gospel Reflection

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

In today's first reading we learn there was 'but one heart and soul' in the ideal community and 'great grace was upon them all'. These beautiful words encourage us to live in a way which accepts people as they are and embrace that diversity within the heart of Jesus.

In the second reading John writes that keeping God's Commandments should not be hard because in doing so we are called to be true to our human nature. In the New Covenant, we are urged to love each other as Jesus loves us and thus be agents of peace, reconciliation and justice: 'Peace through integrity'. These ideas return us to the first reading and lead us into the Gospel.

John's Gospel is set in an atmosphere of fear. It is Easter Sunday, two days after the death of Jesus. The disciples are terrified that as companions of Jesus they too will be arrested and punished. But suddenly Jesus is with them in spite of the locked doors. He is with them in a new way. Three times he reassures them with his declaration, 'Peace be with you' and with it the promise of the gift of the Holy Spirit to accompany them. We too are invited to rest in this promise of peace, amongst the uncertainties and challenges in our lives and world. God has got this. If we have peace in our hearts then it radiates out to our whānau, our communities, our workplaces and our country.

Thomas speaks for many of us for whom seeing is believing. But Thomas found much more than the physical person of Jesus when he declared 'My Lord and my God'. We can find Jesus in our daily encounters with people

and places and experiences if we are open to really 'seeing' Him

We have our own place of peace in our church garden: Te Wā Rangimarie. Its name underlines that this is a physical place of beauty in God's Creation, while also speaking to a season and a spiritual space around peace.
