

God's love has no bounds and no partiality to share with others...

When ants find food, ants never collect food alone, rather it takes a colony of ants, similarly herds of cows and a flock of sheep. Normally humans are individualistic, only in the time of great need, like wars and natural calamities we come together to help others.

The readings for the 6th Sunday of Easter call us to abide in God's love and to share it with others as we continue to grow in our faith journey.

First reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we witness the powerful transformation that takes place when the Gentiles receive the Holy Spirit. Peter's realization that God shows no partiality but accepts all who fear Him and do what is right is a reminder to us that God's love is inclusive and knows no bounds. Let us strive to imitate God's impartial love by welcoming and embracing all people, regardless of their background or circumstances.

The Responsorial Psalm reminds us that the saving power of God is to be proclaimed to All Peoples in all nations. How appropriate is it for us to hear this Psalm as we contemplate the apostolic or missionary calling that each of us has received.


In the second reading from the first letter of John we are reminded that God is love. It is through his love that we are saved and called to love one another as we reflect on the selfless sacrifice of Jesus on the cross.

Let us be inspired to love unconditionally, to forgive generously and to seek reconciliation with those we may have hurt or who have hurt us.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus commands us to abide in his love and to love one another as he loves us. This is no small task - for it requires us to lay down our lives for one another and to be willing to sacrifice our desires and comforts for the well-being of others. As we contemplate the depth of God's love for us, may we be moved to love sacrificially, in selflessly

extending kindness, compassion and forgiveness to all whom we encounter and meet. God blesses us all.
