

Gospel Reflection

A number of years ago my husband and I did a guided tour of the Holy Places in Israel. On a clear calm day, we boarded a wooden boat. It was a replica of the vessel Jesus and the disciples used to cross the Sea of Galilee, going from one side to the other. In the Gospel today, that sea was far from calm and the disciples were terrified – "angry and frightened" – and called out to Jesus, 'Do you not care that we are perishing?'.

Storms can wreck powerful lasting damage. In 1968, would-be rescuers stood helplessly at Seatoun as the inter-island ferry, the Wahine, succumbed in front of them to one of the worst storms in our history. On that day, fifty one people lost their lives.

Today's readings are all about stormy weather, something we may experience more of as a result of climate change. In the first reading, God addresses Job out of the storm. He asks him who it was who stilled the waters?

The responsorial psalm also speaks of the power of God over the sea. 'His command raised up a storm wind which tossed its waves on high.' And later, 'They cried to the LORD in their distress and he hushed the storm to a gentle breeze'.

In the Gospel, the disciple are feeling adrift in a storm on the Sea of Galilee, believing that Jesus doesn't care. He tells them, it is the fear in their hearts that is the problem. 'Why are you afraid? Have you no faith?'

To the people of his time, Jesus' ability to "rebuke" the storm when the disciples called out to him was a sign of divine power, just as God in the Psalm could raise up a storm wind but could also hush it.

There will be tumultuous times when we, like the people of old, call out to the Lord. But the message today is also clear: don't wait till we are in peril to call out to him. Rather, put your trust in him each day even when the weather is

calm and our lives tranquil.
