Amos is sent to prophesy to the people of Israel (First Reading). In the Gospel we have the sending out of the twelve.

Amos was a prophet by divine call. In his case the call had come to a poor, unsophisticated shepherd and 'dresser of sycamore trees', a total outsider to the ranks of professional prophets. Much could be said about the men Jesus chose 'to be with Him'. Jesus having instructed them; the time had come for them to take an active part in His ministry. Their mission was an extension of His own mission and He gave them the power to accomplish this.

In understanding His instructions as to what they were to take with them, we must remember this was only a short mission, limited to the surrounding Jewish town and villages. The final commissioning, in which they would be sent out to the whole world was still in the future.

We too, as disciples of Christ are called and commissioned to live the Gospel in what we say and do and to be witnesses of the glory of God's kingdom.

Recalling that even at the end of the Gospels, Jesus entrusts us with His missionary desire, Pope Francis, therefore, reiterated his call to the faithful "to feel called, because of our baptism, to witness to and proclaim Jesus" and "ask for the grace to bring about a pastoral and missionary conversion".

Ministry though requires team work because we cannot do everything alone.

We need the talents and gifts of others. Our team work in itself is of great witness value. So let us work together in bringing and living the Good News of Jesus Christ.


