From Fr Ravi

The readings for this Sunday intertwine themes of divine provision, unity, and the abundance of God's grace. In the first reading, we witness the miracle of how Elisha, through the power of God, multiplied the loaves of barley and grains to feed a hundred people. This miracle foreshadows Christ's miraculous feeding of the multitudes in the Gospel. The responsorial psalm reinforces the theme by proclaiming God's faithfulness in the eyes of all looking hopefully to you and you give them their food in due season. It celebrates God's generosity and his nearness to all who call upon him in truth. It invites us to trust in God's timing and his care for all his Creation.

The second reading calls the Christian Community to live in unity and peace. He urges us to live in a manner worthy of the calling you have received emphasizing humility gentleness patience and love. Paul speaks of one body and one Spirit one Lord One Faith one baptism and one God and Father of all. This Unity is essential for the church to reflect God's Kingdom on Earth.

In the Gospel of John we encounter Jesus miraculous feeding of the 5000. When faced with a seemingly insurmountable task Jesus demonstrates the power of faith and generosity, a simple offering of five barley Loaves and two fish becomes a feast that satisfies the hunger of thousands. This story is a powerful testament to God's miraculous provision and God's abundant love can transcend our limitations so that our faith in his promise can lead to miraculous outcomes. Todays lesson for us is Faith in God's ability to meet our needs even in the face of challenges that may seem insurmountable, and a willingness to give what we have no matter how insignificant it may seem. This can lead to great things.

Today, in what way do I experience God's provision in my life even when it seemed impossible? How have I responded to moments when I felt inadequate to meet a need, yet saw God use my efforts in a significant way? What small

offering have I given to God that he has used in a powerful way? When have I felt that our actions and words bring glory to God's name? And lead others to experience God's miraculous love and provision?

Pope Francis' Message for the Fourth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly



World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly 2024

This year the fourth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly falls on July 28th, two days following the feast day of Saints Joachim and Anne. It was in January 2021, at the end of his Angelus, where Pope Francis announced the establishment of this dedicated day of celebration. The significance of the announcement, was it falling two days prior to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Pope Francis said, (in regards to Simeon and Anna's recognition of Jesus as the Messiah) "the Holy Spirit even today stirs up thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly....old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between generations, passing on the experience of life and faith to the young. Grandparents are often forgotten and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on."

Final Report of the Royal Commission on Abuse in Care. Wednesday 24 July marks the end of over six years work for the Royal Commission of Inquiry into Abuse in Care. The Royal Commission has been holding hearings and investigating events from 1950 to today. Starting early in the year 2018 with a consultation process, the Inquiry was required to make various reports and provide a final report with findings and recommendations.
