Gospel Reflection

God's power seen best in our weakness

Dictionaries often describe a prophet as someone who can foresee and predict the future, but our three readings today all give a much deeper and richer insight into the prophet's role. This is above all someone who speaks God's truth to an audience that doesn't want to hear it.

Ezekiel, the author of our first reading, is one of the major prophets of the Old Testament and lived about five centuries before Jesus. This morning, we hear how Ezekiel was sent by the Spirit to confront a religious community which had turned away from God and grown rebellious. 'Whether they listen or not, they shall know there is a prophet among them,' is the word Ezekiel hears.

In the second reading, Paul writes to the Christian community in Corinth, telling them that he feels very unequal to the task God has given him. 'My grace is enough for you,' God tells him. 'My power is at its best in weakness.' Paul admits that, to keep him from getting too proud, he has been sent 'a thorn in the flesh'. Scholars debate what this might mean - a physical or psychological ailment of some kind, or perhaps the realisation that there are divisions among the believers in Corinth that he has never been able to resolve. Whatever the problem, Paul writes that he is ready to bear this burden for Christ's sake; 'for it is when I am weak that I am strong.'

Our gospel reading, from Mark, tells of Jesus going with his disciples to his hometown of Nazareth. Even though he is well-known there, or perhaps because of this very fact, his message falls on deaf ears, and he is unable to work any miracles in this climate of faithlessness and disbelief. 'A prophet is only despised in his own house,' Jesus laments.

Who are the prophets in our midst today, and what are they saying to us? Is it

a word about our welcome to refugees and other cultures? Or about child poverty or school lunches? What about Te Tiriti o Waitangi and the rights of Maori in the land that was once their own? How open are we to what the Spirit is saying to us today?
