Gospel Reflection

"What do you want me to do for you?" This is the second Sunday in a row that Jesus asks this question. Firstly, to James and John, the sons of Zebedee and today to Bartimaeus, the blind beggar. In the scheme of things, Bartimaeus's request was more specific and out of sheer desperation.

Jesus and his disciples were leaving Jericho on their way to Jerusalem when Bartimaeus called out, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!'. Those words suggest, he knew who Jesus really was. The surrounding crowd reacted telling Bartimaeus to "Shush!" but he wasn't intimidated and doubled down shouting even louder, 'Jesus, Son of David have mercy on me'.

This stopped Jesus in his tracks. His response to Bartimaeus wasn't to rebuke and silence him like he did the 'man with an evil spirit' (Mark 1:25) nor to presume what he wanted, but to call him over and ask the question, "What do you want me to do for you?". We believe that God's tenderhearted mercy extends to all who are poor, lowly and powerless just like it was to the desperate exiles returning from the northern kingdom of Israel in the first reading, from the prophet Jeremiah. So, Bartimaeus responded to Jesus, 'Master, let me see again'. Without touching him, Jesus acknowledged Bartimaeus's healthy spiritual 'eyesight' with the words, 'Go your faith has saved you' and immediately, he regained his physical sight as well. 'Regained' suggests that Bartimaeus wasn't always blind, but the bible doesn't specifically say so. And just like the first apostles when they were called, Bartimaeus followed Jesus along the way. Whether he followed Jesus all the way to Jerusalem or not; we don't know. Maybe not, it was 30km away and an uphill climb across barren desert. But, more importantly, what Jesus did for Bartimaeus would've changed him for all eternity.

How would you respond to Jesus today if he asked you: "What do you want me to do **for you?**" My prayer is: heal me, Lord of any "blindness" that keeps me staying close to you.




