

Gospel Reflection

Rejoice in the Lord always

In our churches today, the liturgical colour changes from purple to rose or pink. The day is known as Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin word meaning 'rejoice'. The shift in our Advent mood, from a sense of mourning and repentance to one of joyful expectation, reflects the deepening awareness of the Saviour's coming. It's a reminder that the real star in the build-up to Christmas is not us but the One who comes in God's name, whose word is true and who has the power to do what he promises, despite all the evidence to the contrary.

So, we listen with open ears to the prophet Zephaniah, inviting God's people to rejoice with all their heart, because the Lord is in their midst, renewing them by his love. 'Do not let your hands fall limp,' the prophet insists, 'God will exult with joy over you.' If only this could be the word which is heard in Israel and Gaza, Lebanon and Syria today!

Paul writes to the Christians in Philippi with the same message – that there is no cause to worry, because they have everything they need, so long as they pray with faith and thanksgiving. 'The peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and thoughts, in Christ Jesus.' John the Baptist is the last voice we hear in today's readings, responding to the people who ask him what they should do, as the Promised One comes into their world. His reply is simple. 'Share what clothes and food you have with those who have less.' Let the tax collectors take only what they are entitled to, and let soldiers act with justice and integrity.

In the end, says John, someone more powerful than him is coming. John washes with water, but the One for whom the world waits will baptise with the Holy Spirit and fire. It is because we see this promise fulfilled in Jesus that we rejoice today. The real reason for the season is that Christ continues to come, year by year, with a power that can transform our lives. This is the present we await today; let it come this Christmas as never before. Heaven knows how much our world needs it!


