

## **Gospel Reflection**

When I first read todays' gospel, Luke 3:1-6, in preparation for doing this reflection I wondered what I would write about. I did not feel much connection to it; I did not feel it spoke to me. But reading it again today it struck me deeply. The first sentence with its lengthy description that creates a beautiful rhythm sets the scene for the crux of the story, that "God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness." And that gives me hope. In this time when there are increasing threats to justice in our 'wilderness', here at home in Aotearoa New Zealand as well as overseas, we all need to have hope and hold it firmly.

I then spoke to a friend about this reflection, and she asked if there was anything to do with landscape in the reading. (I am a landscape architect). I smiled and then read this passage out to her: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth." Her question made me realise that there is in fact so much in this reading that speaks to me. Sometimes it takes a second look or a prod from someone else to see and hear what you don't see or hear at first. This also happened to me on Sunday evening when I gathered with a group of women to talk and eat together. We share a love of our faith but also sadness regarding issues in the church. We find it hard at times to be hopeful, but we gain strength and insights from our gathering.

While I deeply value the hills that embrace us here in Te Whanganui-a-Tara Wellington and do not want to level them, and the world would be boring with only straight paths, this reading tells me that God can come to me in my

wilderness, particularly when I gather with others, and can give me hope and smooth my rough way.
