Fr Doug's Christmas message

Dear Parishioners

When Micah the prophet was writing, Jerusalem was under siege and David's Jewish Dynasty was in great jeopardy. But salvation would come from a most unlikely and insignificant place - Bethlehem. From there a new leader would come and gather together all the lost, all the exploited, all the disheartened and unite them anew with a loving and merciful God.

Christians see this promise coming in Jesus, the Prince of Peace, who was born in Bethlehem and descended from the line of David.

The Gospel tells the story of Mary's visit to Elizabeth. Both pregnant. Enlightened by the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth praises Mary and hints at the uniqueness of the child she is to conceive.

And as the Second Reading tells us that Jesus did not come to offer the sacrifices of the Old Law, but to do the will of God, His Father. His sacrifice was total obedience to His Father. Even death upon a cross. His one perfect sacrifice did what the sacrifices of the Mosaic Law were unable to do, it brought about reconciliation between God and His people.

"God loves us, and He calls us to do the same: welcoming, protecting, and respecting others. Think of everyone, think of those who are marginalised, those who are far from the joy of Christmas these days. Let us think about everyone with God's kindness. Remember this word: the kindness of God". Pope **Francis**

Thank you for making the kindness of God a reality in this parish in the way you welcome, protect and respect the Christian dignity of others, not just our own parishioners. We give thanks to God.
