

Thus, this is the encounter between Jesus and his people, when Mary and Joseph brought their child to the Temple in Jerusalem; the first encounter between Jesus and his people, represented by Simeon and Anna, took place.

# **Gospel Reflection**

#### A light to enlighten all nations, the glory of God's people

The cycle of ordinary time is interrupted today by the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This recalls the story from Luke's gospel of Mary and Joseph taking their first-born son Jesus to offer him to God 40 days after his birth. The feast is also known as Candlemas, kept alive in many churches by a blessing of candles to be used in the coming year, and reminding us of the words of Simeon in our gospel reading, praising the one who comes as 'a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of God's people.'

Our first reading includes some verses from Malachi, one of the minor prophets and the last of the Old Testament writers. His words have been made famous by their inclusion in Handel's Messiah, 'But who may abide the day of his coming, and who shall stand when he appeareth?' God is about to burst into our world with unprecedented power. The second reading, from Hebrews, reminds us of the same fact, that while Jesus has taken on our humanity, like us in all things except sin, we are called to share in his power and holiness.

The beautiful scene described by Luke tells of how Mary and Joseph fulfilled the law by taking their tiny son to offer him to God as Jewish law required. There's a hint here of how important are the traditions that we inherit from generations that have gone before us – tikanga, family rituals that hold in their unfolding a truth that is often too big to put into words. The wise elders – Simeon, who has served in the temple for many years, and the old woman Anna, who has lived there for many of her 84 years - both recognise that God's promise is about to be fulfilled in Jesus.

This feast is kept as a day of prayer for consecrated life – a day when we pray for the religious who serve us and for those who may feel called by God to join them. We are blessed in this parish by the presence of sisters from several

Congregations, who inspire us by their witness. We pray that others may be called to follow them in ways that reflect God's light for all to see.

# Blessing of the Boats 9 February 2pm at Island Bay Beach

Unique to Island Bay, the Blessing of the Boats ceremony has been adopted in Island Bay by its Italian community since 1933. Boats from all over Wellington line up to be blessed for safe carriage and bountiful catches.

Each year, local and visiting Clergy venture out into the Bay to bless the fishing boats after they've made a trip around Tapu te Ranga Island.

### **Cause news from Rome and Prayer Request**

The Dicastery for the Causes for Saints, has approved for the peer review of the case we have made of an alleged miracle, to be re-examined by two newly appointed doctors. This decision was made following a meeting between our own Archbishop Paul Martin and Cardinal Semeraro, the Prefect for the Causes, in Rome.

If just one of the doctors agrees with our review, the alleged miracle will be reviewed by a full panel of 7 doctors appointed by the Vatican, in the New Year. Their approval to proceed to the final stage is critical for the success of this Cause and the eventual beatification of Venerable Suzanne Aubert Meri Hōhepa
