Gospel Reflection

In the readings for today I was struck by the vivid metaphors from the natural world. Jeremiah writes that without God in our lives we "inhabit the parched places". The Psalmist turns that around proclaiming that when we are with God we are like "a tree planted by a river" which produces fruit. This is a reminder that we are intimately connected with te taiao, the natural world. In fact, the concept of te taiao includes the interconnection of people and nature.

In the Gospel Jesus invites us to join God's kingdom. After taking time to pray he then stands with and in the community, not alone and separate from people. He continues by acknowledging the different social situations and behaviours of the crowd: the poor, hungry, grieving, rejected and insulted. Their struggles resonate today when we see the disparities and inequalities in our communities. Jesus goes on to address us directly with a message of hope: "You are blessed". We are invited to a conversion or transformation of a different kind, in these difficult times. This speaks to us, more than ever, in Aotearoa New Zealand and indeed the world. We must have hope in a vision of the future which is different.


