

"Today more than ever, humanity cries out and calls for peace. Gospel Reflection


In the readings for this Sunday, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, we have an excerpt from Paul's second letter to Timothy. As we know, Paul was initially a persecutor of Christians, and, after his conversion, he became one of those persecuted for being a Christian. Paul's second letter to Timothy is considered the last letter he wrote before his death. In this letter, Paul writes that "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength." It was with God's strength that Paul was able to endure the hardships and carry out his mission.

We also hear the extraordinary story of Peter's liberation from prison, which makes the persecution the early Christians were suffering feel very real. King Herod Agrippa had ordered the death of James, the brother of John. Peter was then arrested and was facing a similar fate. But the Lord sent his angel to liberate Peter. Peter realises what the Lord had done for him. He finds strength in the Lord to continue with his work of building this fledgling Christian movement despite the obvious risk to his life.

Both Peter and Paul found the strength to be the pillars of our

Christian faith, the rock and the fire, because the Lord stood by them. Whenever we feel like the burdens of our lives are too heavy for us, let us remember that the Lord is always standing by us, and giving us strength to carry on.
