From Fr. Biju

The feast of Pentecost brings to an end the Easter season and we are ready to begin our own journey. Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The first public comment made of the new post-resurrectional community of the disciples of Jesus was that they spoke a kind of language that everyone understood. The Pentecost is corrective to the Tower of Babel experience, where hardly anyone spoke a language that another could understand. If the Babel was an attempt out of existential fear to resist a dispersal of people and to play God, the Pentecost is an act of God's Spirit to dispel the fear and empower the new community to traverse every corner of the world, bringing a new language that every human being can understand. What is this language that everyone, beyond the conditionings of space, time or culture can understand? It is the language of love, the lingua franca of the Spirit of God. It is the language Christians are called to speak in and be united in.

Today we might ask what gift of the Spirit, what language do we need so that everybody can understand no matter what their ethnic or linguistic background? Yes, there is such a gift, such a language. It is the language of Love. This is a language that all people understand. In the words of Teilhard de Chardin, 'Love is the only force that can make things one without destroying them'. It is the only language capable of creating a unity that respects diversity – the kind of unity our divided Church, and war-torn and broken world, sorely needs. Like the first apostles, we are now the soldiers of Christ and his witnesses in today's world. May we become aware of the presence of the Spirit in us. Pray for the gift of the language of the Spirit-Love.
