

Gospel Reflection

Today's readings speak to me about women of faith. In the first reading we learn that God promised Sarah and Abraham that they would have a child although Sarah was beyond childbearing years. Both laughed at the very idea but miraculously Sarah gave birth to a son. He was named Isaac which means laughter. So, God works through us even when we are sceptical and he works through us in different ways. Significantly, today is the feast day of St Margaret of Antioch who is the patron saint of childbirth and pregnant women.

In the gospel we hear the familiar story about Jesus visiting Martha and Mary. While Martha was busy with all the domestics Mary was sitting with Jesus. We can learn from this that work is prayer and contemplation is also prayer. While Mary was preparing a meal for them to share together Martha was feeding on a spiritual meal by listening to Jesus. We need to be mindful of both active work and active listening in our complicated lives.

Mary Magdalene, another significant woman in the New Testament, has her feast day this Tuesday. As we know, she stayed with Jesus through his Crucifixion when other disciples abandoned him and she was the first person to whom Jesus appeared after his resurrection. She had the privilege of announcing the news of that miracle.

No matter who we are we can ALL take comfort from Paul's Letter to the Colossians that "Christ is in you". While each of us has been entrusted with different talents, roles and privileges, and we practise our beliefs variously, we are united in our whakapono which translates as faith and trust.
