Dear Parishioners,

In the First Reading we see Abraham interceding with God for the righteous in Sodom, a city full of wicked people. Abraham is troubled by the idea of the innocent being punished along with the guilty, He begins to bargain with God. This Reading highlights the importance of intercessory prayer, and reveals a lot about the mercy of God.

It also highlights by being righteous, we follow the Commandments God has given us and listening attentively to His Word and prayer is an essential and important part of this. Prayer is a frequent theme Luke uses in his Gospel and in today's Gospel Jesus speaks about the way we need to pray with persistence and confidence.

"For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks, it will be opened." The Our Father is the first and greatest of all Christian prayers it contains the way we should live our lives in tune with the mind of Christ, because undoubtedly this is how He Himself prayed and lived. The Lord's Prayer is the prayer of the Church, confirming a person's identity as a beloved child of God, and reminding Catholics of the responsibility owed toward their brothers and sisters in Christ, Pope Francis said 2018.

"Our Father': these two simple words offer us a roadmap for the spiritual life," the pope said in a homily at Mass in Geneva.

For the next eleven days I will in Melbourne visiting my beloved niece and great niece, who is now 12 years old and who I baptised some years ago

at St Benedict's church in Khandallah. I will be keeping you all in my prayers as I hope you will keep me in yours.
