## **Gospel Reflection**

After the seasons of Easter and Pentecost and the feast days that follow in their wake, we return today to the season of ordinary time, picking up the narrative from St Luke, our gospel writer for this year. But in the story he tells, there is no such thing as ordinary time, for Jesus is really present in our world and the call to help his kingdom come means that every moment is charged with extraordinary grace, with outcomes we shall never know this side of the grave.

The missionaries Jesus sends out ahead of him remind us of the 70 elders whom Moses chose to support his leadership (Numbers 11:24). They seem in many ways untrained for the job. If they succeed at all, it is only because the Spirit which Jesus imparts is at work within them. He tells them that the kingdom of God is near; they don't have to wait for another world, before God's purposes are achieved. Now is the moment of salvation, here and now an eternal outcome is being produced through their efforts.

They go out in pairs; it's a collaborative mission they share. Like the pilgrimage of hope we are currently undertaking for this holy year, their efforts are the stronger because what they do is done together. And it is in the peace they bring that the goodness of God is seen. As Pope Leo has reminded us from his first words to the world, our task is to build bridges that unite, to take down the walls that keep people apart, to heal divisions and proclaim that all are loved equally by the God whom Jesus reveals as father.

Paul makes the same declaration in our second reading, the closing verses of his Letter to converts in Galatia. The wounds he bears from his travels and imprisonment are badges of honour; the marks on his body 'are those of Jesus'. The old categories of whether we are circumcised or not count for nothing; what matters is that we have become 'an altogether new creature'.

What is the gift we can share, from our faith in Jesus? Whom can we ask to join us in our efforts to reach out to others? What is the mission to which God is currently calling us?
