## **Gospel Reflection**

As a teenager, one of the first records I purchased was the album "War" by U2. The last track on that album was an odd song named "40". It is a slower, yearning, and spiritual song. I didn't know it for some time, but the song was based on the words of today's Psalm. I have always loved the positive and uplifting tone of the song.

"I waited patiently for the Lord.

He inclined and heard my cry.

He brought me up out of the pit

Out of the miry clay.

I will sing, sing a new song...."

Psalm 40 reminds us that when overwhelmed by adversity, God is our steadfast help, and faith during life's struggles can lead to transformation. While I find the words of today's Psalm comforting, the words of today's Gospel are confronting for me. How can the "Prince of Peace" talk about bringing fire to earth and division among families?

The text is written in a tone that makes apologies for what it has to say. After some reading, I learned this is not a literal instruction but a recognition of the divisions in families and society that can naturally arise when one truly chooses to follow Jesus. We are called to embrace a challenging faith.

Like Jeremiah in the first reading, we may face opposition for living out our beliefs. Like the early Christians in the second reading, we need to "run the race" with perseverance, fixing our gaze on Jesus.

And like the fire Jesus came to bring, our faith should be a transformative

force, even if it means facing division. Let us pray for the grace to be courageous disciples, trusting that the Lord will always draw us from the miry bog and set our feet upon a rock.
