### From Fr Doug

Dear Parishioners,

Truly, God wills that all people should be saved. People will come from all the world to share in the messianic kingdom, and the Jews will have no advantage over the Gentiles. Jesus refuses to speculate on the numbers who will be saved, "Lord, will those who are saved be few?" That is best left to the wisdom and mercy of God.

The main thing is: the kingdom is present and the door open. But the door is not so wide that people can saunter casually in at their own convenience; it is a narrow opening through which they must thrust themselves with trust and determination.

The message was originally intended for the Jews, but Luke now intends it as a warning to the disciples of Jesus, then and now! There were those who thought they could enter the kingdom because their commitment was only in mere words and not in active involvement in being a disciple.

And Jesus warns, "Strive to enter through the narrow door." Do it now, do not wait to enter God's household. Salvation depends on the mercy and favour of our God and in the honest struggle to actively follow His ways.




