Gospel reflection

Kia ora koutou,

With so much volatility and unrest and uncertainty in our world, many people are anxious and looking for answers. In today's Gospel, Nicodemus - a Pharisee and member of the Jewish ruling council - is also seeking answers. He has heard Jesus teaching in the Synagogue and has sought out Jesus under cover of darkness to learn from him.

Jesus refers Nicodemus to the passage in today's first reading from Numbers. God had saved the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and led them through the desert under the guidance of Moses. Instead of being grateful, the people had grown impatient and demanding. A plague of serpents was then sent against them because of their constant complaining against God. Eventually when they beg Moses for help God tells him to put an image of a serpent on a pole. All those who looked at this bronze serpent would be healed.


Now Jesus tells Nicodemus that just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert so must the Son of Man be lifted up.

The Gospel writer, John, then records what is considered one of the most profound messages of the Gospel. God so loved the world that he gave his only son so that everyone who believes in him might not die but might have eternal life. God did not send his son into the world to condemn the world but that the world might be saved through him. And, as the second reading notes, despite his divine origin, Jesus emptied himself taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness.

Such is the immense love God has for his people he was willing to give his only son as a saviour. In your quiet times this week, ponder how this act of love shows the lengths to which God was willing to go in order to reconcile humanity to himself.

Reflect on the incredible value placed on each of us by God. Look at some ways you can get to know your neighbours and community better. Take time, too, to pray for peace in our hearts and in our world.
