Dear Parishioners

Amos was an ardent champion for social justice and equity. He assailed vigorously those who would trample on the needy and the poor and on a so-called system which denied them any hope of social justice and equity. This short reading is a good example of this. Amos depicts the greed of the wealthy, who can't wait for the Holy Days to be over so that they can get back to making money by dubious means.

He condemns the separation of worship from the proper treatment of all people, especially the poor.

As Fr. Flor McCathy SDB, reminds us the Bible does not always give us examples to be imitated. It sometimes gives us examples to be learned painfully. The servant in Jesus' story is surely one of these to bring to the attention of His listeners the wise use of money.

Jesus was not holding up a wicked servant as a role model. He was saying something can be learnt from this, 'one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much.' And of course, 'No servant can serve two masters; you cannot serve God and money.'

For Luke, to use money wisely is to give to the poor and thus ensure eternal salvation.
