## **Gospel reflection**

Why are we so obsessed with Heaven and Hell?

Dare I ask it, do the different depictions in the scriptures misguide us? What I don't understand is how does anyone know, who has been to Heaven or Hell and returned to Earth apart from Christ?

Today's Gospel discusses the parable of the rich man and Lazarus a poor man entering Heaven and Hell. Don't we all give to the poor? Aren't we all sometimes excessive? Does that mean we are going to Hell? I don't think so. Parables are made-up stories so maybe I'm taking it too literally.

In the second reading Paul urges Timothy to pursue Godly virtues. To "Fight the good fight of the faith"

Righteousness, Godliness, Faith, Love, Endurance, Gentleness.

Aren't they just beautiful. It also explains that our Lord Jesus Christ is the "King of Kings and the Lord of Lords", I find these words so powerful.

He dwells in unapproachable light. God is perfectly holy.

The first reading is from Amos (a shepherd and farmer from Judah (the southern kingdom), called by God to speak mainly to Israel (the northern kingdom) around 760–750 BC) states "Woe to those who are complacent in Zion". Zion refers to people living in Jerusalem, Amos explains to the leaders, elite, wealthy class that their sense of security is false. I was interested in the reference to them lying about beds of ivory, apparently the wealthy elite decorated their furniture (beds, couches, thrones) with inlaid ivory — not solid ivory, but wood covered with ivory panels. Ivory was a luxury import, extremely rare and costly. These privileged people were not made ill by the collapse of Joseph, therefore were the first to go into exile. "Joseph" is used as a poetic name for the northern kingdom of Israel.

God gives us a choice, free will. Am I going to Heaven, should I stop spending money I don't need to and give it to the poor? Maybe.

I don't obsess about Heaven and Hell, I used to as a child, the imagery could be so brutal. I just try to be Christian in what I do.

Forehead: "May the Word of God be in my mind" (to understand it).

Lips: "...on my lips" (to speak it and share it). Heart: "...and in my heart" (to love it and live it).


