People suffering from Leprosy were considered unclean and were living in a state of condemnation with all ties to society cut off.


In our modern times, Leprosy may represent all the problems affecting mankind like lack of food, water and shelter. Spiritually, it could also relate to lack of



White Sunday: 12 October 2025

Celebrating faith, family, and the future.

White Sunday, or Lotu Tamaiti, is one of the most important days in the Samoan calendar. It is a day where children lead church services, recite verses, sing, and are celebrated by their families and communities. Traditionally, everyone dresses in white, symbolising purity and renewal. For many Samoans, White Sunday is more than a single event. It represents faith, family, and the responsibility to nurture the next generation. It's a day where the voices of tamaiti are uplifted, reminding us of the central place of children in fa'a Samoa.

Here at St Anne's after the 9am mass this Sunday the children celebrate with singing and a scripture story of the prodigal son. Children, parents and families will join us but anybody is welcome to watch.
