Gospel Reflection

SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST KING OF THE UNIVERSE

On this final Sunday of the Liturgical Year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. instituted by Pope Pius xi in 1925 through his encyclical 'Quas Primas,' the feast was intended to reassert the supremacy of Christ in a world increasingly attracted to secularism, nationalism and ideological extremism. We are invited to contemplate a kingship rooted in compassion and humility, and a love that draws all things in unity. The self-giving of the cross challenges the domination and self-interest of all worldly power. Christ's kingdom of gentleness and mercy is the Inheritance of all who turn to Him in their needs and the responsibility of all His followers.

In the Gospel Luke 23:35-43 says that the crucified Christ is mocked by many, yet recognised as King by a dying criminal, who receives the promise of Paradise.

The solemnity of Christ the King, invites the Church to reflect deeply on the Kingship of Christ, on who Christ is for us, and on the nature of His kingdom. The gospel also takes us to an unlikely place; to Jesus' brutal and lonely crucifixion. Yet, in this moment of seeming defeat, the Power of God is revealed, and a kingdom of Gentleness is born. The leaders, soldiers and even one of the crucified criminals join in a chorus of derision; 'He saved others: let Him save Himself if He is the Messiah of God, His chose one.' Their taunting assumes that the real power would surely assert itself through strength and self-preservation, an expectation that is prevalent today as it was 2,000 years ago.

Yet, Jesus does not respond according to the logic of violent, worldly power. He is not provoked by those who taunt Him, and in His agony, He remains silent. His silence is not weakness, but a sovereign choosing of peace and forbearance.

Always remember, God loves us no matter what, therefore, we need to do the same to others through the help of the Holy Spirit. Let us be happy and enjoy life by celebrating this great feast of "CHRIST OUR KING".
