Gospel Reflection

Proclaiming good news to the poor

From our kitchen window I can see the cedar, reputedly from Lebanon, which grows at the entrance to St Anne's. Beyond the roof of the Muslim family living across the road from us, the top branches now billow in the wind above the church's glass roof. I contemplated the scene often last week, as I reflected on the visit to Lebanon by Pope Leo, who in a couple of days urged leaders of other faiths to build peace and reconciliation on their common beliefs, challenged young people to be courageous in their faith, and especially comforted family members who grieved for those killed in the terrible port explosion which rocked Beirut in 2020.

Lebanon's cedars are mentioned more than 100 times in the Bible, and the land was celebrated for its rich fertility in Jesus' own time. In today's first reading, Isaiah praises its fruitfulness as a sign of God's splendid bounty. There is a lovely parallel between our Old Testament reading and the answer Jesus sends in the gospel to John the Baptist, now in prison, about the blind seeing, the deaf hearing, the lame walking and the poor hearing good news. Even the dead are raised, 'and happy those who do not lose faith in me.' We are being challenged to believe in the prophet's word that God will provide a better future. Pope Leo was proclaiming an alternative to the despair that so easily takes root when countries turn to war and violence to resolve their problems. His message echoed that of other recent popes, that if we want peace, we must build on justice and reconciliation.

The word in our second reading, from the letter of St James, is that we need to be patient. 'Think of the farmer,' he writes, 'how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn and spring rains. You too must be patient; do not lose heart.' When we look at the damage done by cyclones, especially when slash has blocked bridges and caused widespread flooding, we are being forced to rethink how we care for our common home. We need to listen with new ears to what our poor Earth is telling us, if we are not to be brought to judgment, says St James. May the Lord who comes this Christmas help us to listen and learn.

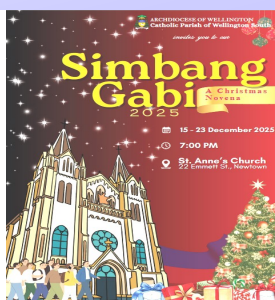

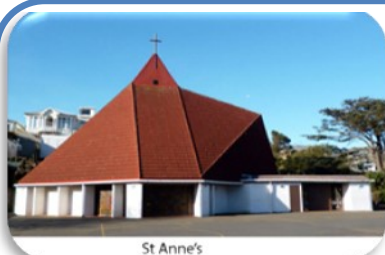
