

From Fr Biju

Today, Jesus talks about following the Law. **God's Law of love can be thought of as rules that we are to follow in order to show our love and respect for one another.** Jesus says that He came to fulfil the Law. Unlike the Pharisees who were more on ritual purity, Jesus calls for a deeper, heart-centered righteousness that goes beyond mere legalistic observance. It is embracing the spirit of the law, which is rooted in love, mercy and justice. Jesus also calls our attention to how our relationships need to reflect the living law of God. We are to take radical measures to avoid sin, maintain inner purity, and guard our thoughts and desires when it comes to interacting with others.

Here is Lent, our favourable time: Lent begins with **ASH WEDNESDAY**. It is a "favourable time," a season of grace. Lent is a gift that the Church in her wisdom celebrates every year. During this period, we are called to be with Jesus, to suffer and die to ourselves, die to sin and to give up the evil in and around us, so that we can rise, individually and as a community, to a deeper Christian life, become more available to God and to people, and capable of rendering service with love. Why do we still undergo this ritual of ashes that is centuries old, as old as the prophets who pleaded with God's people to turn back from sin and toward God? We go because, at least once a year we need to be reminded that our deepest hunger is the hunger for God.

The way is conversion and repentance. It is summed up in three ways, as almsgiving...caring for people; as praying.... listening to God's word, who whispers to us to come back to the God who created us; and as fasting... giving up our selfishness and over-indulged appetites so that we may understand the hunger that can be filled—with the grace of God. We express our willingness to be converted when we receive the ashes. The prayer of the whole Church, the Body of Christ, is that each year the sign of the cross penetrates a little deeper and moves us toward fuller conversion toward the light of Christ. I pray that during this lent, we may grow closer to God and prepare our hearts for the Easter joy. Have a blessed season of Lent.


SFDS Jubilee Weekend Sat 18 Apr-Sun 19 April 2026

The School and Church of St Francis de Sales are inextricably linked. Not just in the school's use of the Church for liturgies, assemblies and teaching but in the real spirit that has evolved since 1905.

Ever since the initial St Francis de Sales School was established in 1905, the story of St Francis De Sales and St Madeleine Sophie have reflected the story of the Catholic school system.

The first Catholic school in Island Bay was opened by the Sisters of the Sacred Heart in Avon St, Island Bay in 1905. The school had one classroom and nine students. Then in 1926, a larger brick building was opened , on a separate site but also in Avon St, and was named after St Madeleine Sophie, the foundress of the Society of the Sisters of the Sacred Heart.
