## Gospel reflection

In today's Gospel Jesus challenges us to be "salt of the earth" and "light of the world". This is not a call to personal glory, but a challenge to active service. Salt must season and light must brighten. The First Reading from Isaiah clarifies how this light is to shine by moving from the sanctuary to the community: by sharing bread with the hungry and sheltering the oppressed. The Psalmist urges us to "give generously to the needy" and be unfailingly kind.

Last Friday we commemorated Waitangi Day. For us, living in Aotearoa New Zealand, these readings resonate deeply with the spirit of Te Tiriti o Waitangi.


Just as Isaiah calls for justice as a prerequisite for God's light to shine, the Treaty as a covenant should be the foundation for justice, partnership, and mutual respect between Māori and Pākehā in our country. In this context to be "salt" means honouring these promises and "light" means exposing and healing the injustices of inequality or historical grievance.

St. Paul reminds us that our faith should not rest on "human wisdom" but on God's power.

This power is visible when we stand together (Together for the Treaty) with the marginalised. Justice is commanded by both our Gospel and our Te Tiriti covenant, ensuring that our salt never loses its flavour.


